Course Restrictions	None. Please note we do not offer Master's level courses for exchange students. Exchange students can take any upper year undergraduate courses at Mount Allison provided they have the appropriate pre-requisites from their home university.
Credits & Course Information	<p>Minimum full-time course load: 9 credits per semester (3 courses) Maximum full-time course load: 15 credits per semester (5 courses)</p> <p>Please note: Exchange students should plan to take a minimum of 3 courses per term and a maximum of 5 courses. Most Mount Allison students take 5 courses per term. Exchange students are encouraged to speak to their home university to find out how many courses/credits they should be registered in while on exchange in order to fulfil home university requirements.</p>
Additional Course Information	Exchange students can take courses in a variety of programs or subjects while at Mount Allison. They are not limited to one faculty or program. Students can mix and match courses based on their interests however, students must have appropriate pre-requisites. This means that students must have taken a similar course at their home university. All Bachelor's degrees at Mount Allison University are four year programs and students typically declare a major and a minor after their second year. Typically, 1 st year courses at Mount Allison start with the number 1, 2 nd year courses start with the number 2, 3 rd year courses start with a 3 and 4 th year courses start with a 4.
Course Registration Information	The course calendar for 2020-2021 AY will be available beginning in April 2020. Exchange students are asked to list the courses they are interested in taking on the exchange application. However, they will only be registered in courses once they have received an offer letter and have paid their registration deposit. Typically exchange students who will come for the fall term will be registered in courses in July and students who will come for the winter term will be registered in November/December. Ms. Robin Walker will assist students with the course registration process and will contact students once they have paid their deposit to confirm their course list.

Nomination Procedure	In order to nominate students, partner universities should send an email to studyabroad@mta.ca with the following information about the nominated student: full name, email address, date of birth, academic program of study and term they are coming to Mount Allison. Nominations should be received by April 15 for the fall term and September 15 for the winter term.

Student can also find available courses by searching the Course Timetable for the term they will be on exchange and can be found by searching "course timetable" on the Mount Allison website.	
Application Requirements	<p>Minimum GPA Requirement: minimum 3.0 on a 4.0 GPA scale</p> <p>Acceptable Language Test & Minimum Language Requirement: TOEFL score of 90 (internet test), 580 (paper test), 213 (computer test) (DI Code 0939) with no band score lower than 20; International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of 6.5 with no band score lower than 6.0</p>	
Submitting Application Documents	Nominated exchange students should submit the completed application form and other supporting documents (transcript, copy of passport) as one electronic file to studyabroad@mta.ca . The required documents can be submitted by the home university's study abroad office or by the nominated exchange student themselves.

Fee Payment	Exchange students should pay the \$100 registration deposit and a \$250 housing deposit for one term or \$500 housing deposit for the full year after they receive their offer letter through Flywire. Students will then pay the remainder of their student fees owing (housing, meal plan and student fees) approximately two weeks after the term begins.	
Accommodation	On campus residence rooms are guaranteed for exchange students. Once exchange students have paid the registration and housing deposits they can complete the residence application and will be placed in a room in one of the seven on campus residences.
