INCOMING INTERNACIONAL MOBILITY STUDENTS

If your university does not hold a protocol with the School of Arts and Humanities, you can apply as Visiting Student. Tuition fees are estimated based on the number of ECTS for each course unit or according to the number of semester attending the School of Arts and Humanities.

The School of Arts and Humanities has a remarkable track record offering higher education in the areas of Archaeology, Classical Studies, Portuguese Studies, Philosophy and History.

An Innovative School

Students are offered the unique opportunity to combine various disciplinary fields by means of the flexible design of its courses. Arts and Humanities, Portuguese Studies and Languages, Literatures and Cultures encompass all the disciplinary areas of our School. The first degree in General Studies further allows for the combination of all course units of the School of Arts and Humanities with other ULisboa Schools including: the Faculty of Fine Arts, the Faculty of Sciences, the Faculty of Law or the Faculty of Psychology.

A Multicultural School

Over 2 500 foreign students annually attend the School of Arts and Humanities, including incoming exchange students, international students and external students enrolling in Portuguese language courses.



An International School The School of Arts and

Humanities of ULisboa is an important hub within a very wide international network of high-ranking higher education institutions. The wide range of courses offered benefits from carefully selected student and staff exchange protocols with top-ranking universities. The School of Arts and Humanities is organized into four main disciplinary areas: History, Linguistics, Literatures, Arts and Cultures, and Philosophy.



These four disciplinary areas encompass seven departments, eight Interdisciplinary Programmes, ten Research Centres and one Chair. The School of Arts and Humanities offers 17 undergraduate degrees as well as postgraduate degrees, including 28 Masters and 23 Doctoral Degree programmes. It additionally offers 21 Diploma Programmes and a wide range of Foreign Language Courses, as complementary training to both regular and external students. With a successfully system of internships and more than 500 international agreements, including Erasmus bilateral agreements and protocols for student and staff exchange, our degrees develop the skills needed to succeed in a globalized world.

Degrees Offered in Cooperation with Other ULisboa Schools and Further Higher Education Institutions

Thanks to a fruitful cooperation with other Faculties, Institutes and Schools of ULisboa, as well as with other higher education institutions, the School of Arts and Humanities has a selective range of strongly interdisciplinary undergraduate and postgraduate degrees.

Degrees with a Flexible Major/Minor Struture Undergraduate degrees offer students the possibility of selecting Majors (comprising 10 course units) and Minors (comprising 5 course units). A flexible structure comprehending mandatory and a very wide range of optional course units allows students to combine their main areas of interest in a fully customized degree. The four undergraduate degrees with a Major/Minor structure currently offered are: Arts and Humanities; General Studies; Languages, Literatures and Cultures; and Portuguese Studies.

Courses in Foreign Languages The School of Arts and Humanities offers 27 different foreign language courses as part of its degrees or as intensive courses at the Language Centre*, as well as Portuguese Language Courses for foreigners at the Institute of Portuguese Culture and Language* and Chinese Language (Mandarin) at the Confucius Institute.*
