The **HAPPEE** project is designed to improve outcomes for children at Le Chéile by placing University of Limerick students from physiotherapy, speech and language therapy and occupational therapy in the school.

The UL students - supervised by clinical supervisors from St. Gabriel's Foundation and supported by UL - will work with school staff, whole class groups, individual children and their families to support the children with any needs they may have.

The UL students will work with families/caregivers/the school on how they can help the children at home and in school to achieve their functional goals.
