About the site:

Mungret College is the current location of Mungret Heritage and the Limerick Christian Way's school and church. The property also houses a playground, a coffee shop, and a bookstore. Throughout Mungret several interpretive panels explain the history and importance of Mungret Abbey, St. Nessan's Church, and the graveyards.



About the project:

Our task was to create the foundations for a historical information room at Mungret College. The main aspects of the project included designing informational panels for the walls of the room and producing a map brochure of the interpretative panels that already exist at the site. We utilized information from online resources as well as an archeological assessment to create the content of the panels. The brochure contains images from Mungret Hertitage.



Outcomes:

- Map Brochure of the existing Mungret interpretive panels
- Indoor interpretive panels:
 - ⇒ Design for Early Medieval: Church and Graveyards of Mungret panel
 - ⇒ Text for Mesolithic and Neolithic panel
 - ⇒ Text for Bronze Age panel
- Video of Mungret College history (10 minutes)

Recommendations:

- Timeline to go on wall opposite the new panels (~1850's present)
- Better layout of services (ie. bookshop, meeting rooms)
- New videos: Christian Learning Center and Mungret Parish
- Interview/ testimonies from Dorothy, William, past pupils, etc.
