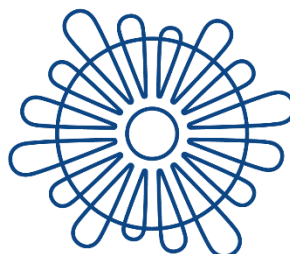

Food	<p>The Ministry of Science and Education provides all Erasmus+ and CEEPUS students with the student card (<i>X-card</i>). The card is issued by the Office for undergraduate and graduate students of the University of Zadar and it costs 11,70 €. It enables students to get meals at the discount price at the student restaurant. Other categories of the incoming students are not entitled to get the student card (<i>X-card</i>).</p>
