Study Options For their exchange stay, students can either choose a

- semester package or
- draw up an individual schedule.

Individual schedule

- Modules can be chosen from different programs, different semester levels and, if places are free, even from different faculties.
- Students have to ensure that they meet all individual prerequisites for the modules they wish to enroll in. This is especially important if Bachelor students opt to choose some of our Master modules.
- There are no general course restrictions, however modules in double degree or jointly offered programs which belong to the course offer of the partner university are not open for exchange students (e.g. courses of the University of Stuttgart (identifiable by the module code starting with "6").

Module selection

Course catalog | section "Modules for Incomings"

- Shows all semester-dependent information in a hierarchical structure. The first level is the semester, followed by the faculties. The next subdivisions are language of instruction for the Faculty of Natural Sciences and the Faculty of Business, Economics and Social Sciences, Bachelor or Master Level | language of instruction for the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences.
- Useful for getting an impression on what kind of modules are taught in a winter or a summer semester at a certain faculty or related to a certain subject area.
- The new course catalogues is available approx. 6 weeks before the start of the respective semester. For a pre-planning of the curriculum, the course catalogue of the respective semester of the previous academic year can be consulted.

Module catalog

- Shows the semester-independent information, e.g. content, number of ECTS, teaching language, prerequisites.

Exchange students are allowed to apply for modules with a limited number of participants, e.g. field trips, exercises, practical courses etc., but places cannot be guaranteed in advance.

Language requirements

The language of instruction in all Bachelor programs is **German**. On Master level, **German and English** programs are offered. A minimum **level of B2** in the desired language(s) of instruction is highly recommended.

Language courses

"German in the Region of Porsche and Schiller" is offered as an intensive course before the beginning of the semester (reduced fees for exchange students). The Language Centre also offers a variety of semester courses on all levels in German as a foreign language, including German for Academic Purposes and Business German (small fee).

Accommodation

Exchange students can apply for a room in the student residences on campus. Rent for rooms ranges from € 250 - 350.

International Students Organisation (ISO)

The ISO Buddy Program matches exchange students with a Hohenheim student for guidance and support in the first days after arrival, incl. pick-up service. In addition, ISO organises excursions, cultural events and parties.

Unique Aspects of the University

- ✓ The University of Hohenheim is the **oldest university in Stuttgart**. Founded in 1818 by King William I of Württemberg as teaching, experimental, and model institute in order to radically counteract the devastating famines of the early 19th century, Hohenheim considered itself to be a place of innovation and ideas for society's needs from the very beginning. Thus, Hohenheim is traditionally committed to developing innovative solutions for some of society's pressing problems.
- ✓ Currently, around **9.000 students** attend courses of study in the fields of Natural Sciences, Agricultural Sciences and Business, Economics and Social Sciences. Approximately 13% of the students are from abroad, coming from nearly 100 different countries and Hohenheim prides itself on its **strong international ties**.
- ✓ Being one of the few **campus universities** in Germany, all important buildings are accessible by foot. Germany's students even crowned the University of Hohenheim campus to be the most beautiful campus in Baden-Württemberg. In Germany, the University reached 6th place (beauty) and 10th place (architecture). The hallmark is the **baroque Hohenheim Palace**. Surrounded by the historical park and botanical gardens, the university offers a once-in-a-lifetime study atmosphere.

- ✓ A distinguished Opera, spectacular museums, Germany's unofficial Hip Hop capital and green metropolis: **Stuttgart** is renowned not only for its cars and its wine.
