Required documentation	It is necessary to send the following documentation to incoming@nebrija.es : 1. Filled application form 2. Photocopy of passport 3. Photocopy of transcript history of home university studies 4. Certificate of B2-level Spanish ability to study subjects taught in Spanish, or similar B2 certificate in English for students who wish to take any classes taught in English. In both cases this is a requirement <u>only for students who are non-native in these languages</u> . 5. Photocopy of medical insurance valid in Spain		
Payment Methods	Paying students in the <u>Integrated Programs</u> would generally need to use the Flywire service to pay for their tuition (remember that exchange students are exempt). Paying students in the <u>Hispanic Studies Program</u> or in <u>Spanish PLUS*</u> , or who wish to contract housing with a local family or in one of our official Residences may need to pay by credit card or by bank transfer. *NOTE: No partner institution discount can be applied to the Spanish PLUS program.

<p>Local Airport</p>	<p>Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas International Airport (Airport code: MAD)</p>	
<p>Approximate Cost of Living</p>	<p>Accommodation: Varies widely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A rented room in the city can average 460€/month (utilities not included), whereas a rented studio apartment can be 800€/month HomeStay with a family (arranged through the University) during 2023-2024 will be <u>960€/month</u> for half room and board; full room and board will be <u>1.125€/month</u>. There may be limited spots at our Residence Halls, their pricing ranges from <u>1040€/ month</u> to <u>1445€/ month</u>. <p>Study materials/books: Depends on the programme. In the Hispanic Studies Programme, students may spend an average of 45€ per course, for example. In an Integrated Programme, students may spend 30€ per semester.</p> <p>Food/drink: At the discretion of the student. Average prices for meals at restaurants are breakfast, 3-5€; lunch, 12-15€; dinner, 10-15€. What students spend on groceries varies widely.</p> <p>Transportation: Monthly pass prices on the Metro de Madrid Web site: https://www.metromadrid.es/en/travel-in-the-metro/fares-and-tickets/tickets#panel2.</p> <p>Students under the age of 25 may apply for a pass that covers all zones for 20€ each month - https://www.comunidad.madrid/servicios/transporte/abono-joven-todo-madrid-tu-alcance</p>
