Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences

The faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences at University of Limerick offers a wide range of subjects across seven academic departments and the University of Limerick Language Centre. Students can choose classes in Irish language, history, culture and music as well as an accredited practicum that links students directly with the Limerick community. Journalism and media students have the opportunity to use our recording studios, newsroom and editing suites, which are all equipped to the highest standards.

Education and Health Sciences

If you're interested in studying in the medical and allied health professions, you'll find some of the most progressive programmes in these fields here at UL. UL nursing and midwifery students have access to world-class facilities, including a midwifery suite. Our labs simulate hospital wards and healthcare spaces, allowing you to get a sense of what it's like to work in the field. Similarly, we are known for our extensive sport and fitness facilities available to students studying in areas like health and fitness, sport science and coaching.

Kemmy Business School

The Kemmy Business School is one of the largest business schools in Ireland and has been awarded Triple Crown accreditation, placing it in the top 1% of international business schools in the world. The Kemmy Business School, or KBS, offers a wide range of business and management education programmes. In addition to modern lecture theatres and study spaces, the building also has a Wall Street style trading floor, the first of its kind in Ireland. The school welcomes Ireland's top business leaders and entrepreneurs regularly for guest lectures and events, which are held in its 350-seater main lecture theatre.

Science and Engineering


The University leads the way in innovation in science and engineering programmes and has a long history of industry collaboration for teaching and research. UL is home to the famous Bernal Institute, which consists of four research areas – a dream for budding scientists and engineers. UL students have gone on to win many awards, including the national leg of the James Dyson Award. Our ccience and engineering faculty offers a multitude of high-tech facilities, including Ireland's only academic flight simulator, the 'ATP' which is a unique robotic machine in Ireland, and the Titan Themis Microscope – one of the world's most advanced instruments.

Applying to Study Abroad at University of Limerick

To spend a semester or year at University of Limerick as a visiting student, you can apply through your home universities' Study Abroad office or through an approved Study Abroad provider.

What documents will I need to provide?

To apply for the Study Abroad Programme you will need to provide:

- Current official undergraduate degree transcript showing your overall GPA.
- Copy of your passport (photo page).
- English language certificate (if English is not your first language).
- Approval from your home university.

Entry Requirements

GPA

Students are required to have a cumulative GPA of 2.9 from their current home university.

English Language

CEFR: Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – B2.

TOEFL: TOEFL 550 (paper-based) 210 (computer-based) / 80 (internet-based).

IELTS: Minimum overall score of 6.0.

Duolingo English Test: The minimum requirement for Duolingo English Test (DET) is a

score of 110.

Immigration

Many non-EU students entering Ireland must show airport officials a valid entry visa. North American students do not require an entry visa but are required to have an offer letter from UL at the entry airport and will be required to register with the Irish Immigration Service for the duration of their stay. The immigration registration fee is €300.



UL Sport is now home to Ireland's tallest climbing wall at 21 metres high. We also have the UL Boathouse, situated on the riverbank and home to Ireland's only Indoor Rowing Tank. In the nearby town of Killaloe (25km away), you'll find the UL Sport Outdoor Adventure Centre, where you can experience a host of on land and water-based activities including sailing, windsurfing, canoeing, rock climbing and more.







Living on-campus is one of the best ways to enjoy life at UL. Based on UL's distinctive riverside parkland campus, students can choose to live in one of UL's eight villages offering 2, 4 and 6-bedroomed apartments. Students have their own private study bedroom equipped with a good size study desk and free access to high-speed internet via the UL network. All accommodation offers a private bedroom with shared living space and kitchen and some of our apartment style residences also have an en-suite option. Living on-campus offers a convenient, safe and affordable option for students. Each village has a village manager, who is available 8am – 8pm from Monday – Friday as well as on campus security 24/7.



Rainbow Housing

University of Limerick was the first university in Ireland to offer Rainbow Housing. Rainbow housing is for students who wish to live together in an on-campus house/apartment that supports the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, intersex and allied community at UL. Residents of rainbow housing create and maintain a living space that is affirming to all sexual and gender identities.

The new UL Student Centre, a 3,529 square metre four-storey building, is in a prime location at the heart of UL campus. Dining On Campus

Being a student is hungry work. On campus at University of Limerick, there are a great range of restaurants, cafés and bars offering high-quality home cooked food at budget conscious prices. A foodie tour of UL can involve anything from a takeaway roll from the supermarket deli all the way up to a fine dining experience in the East Room at Plassey House, with any number of tasty options in-between, including our weekly Farmer's Market every Tuesday which brings local food suppliers onto campus.

Feel Supported at UL

At UL we take pride in our Student Supports – because they're all here to help you have **the best university experience possible**.

Staying well, both physically and mentally, is a critical part of successful student life. Studying abroad can throw up some unexpected challenges for any student, however at University of Limerick we have award-winning supports available for all international students. Wellbeing services including student counselling and health services are based in the main building as well as various learning centres located around the campus, with specialised support for writing, maths, ICT and science.

Orientation

All Study Abroad students will embark on a detailed, weeklong orientation before classes begin ensuring that all students are settled, comfortable and confident ahead of the new semester. From airport collection and welcome coffees to student essentials, timetables and culture shock we cover all areas of life at UL.

The aim of the UL Global Orientation programme is to ensure Study Abroad students have a smooth transition and integration into the campus community. For those students who require extra support, a one-to-one session online or in-person can be made with a member of the Study Abroad team.



Chaplaincy

Often the first reference point for a student in need of help. The Chaplaincy Centre (Teach Fáilte), located in the Student Centre, is open daily from 10.30am to 4.30pm. Individuals or groups are welcome for a casual cup of coffee and chat or in times of difficulty, students are assured of a listening ear and may be facilitated to avail of other supports on or off campus. This fantastic service is not limited to those of a religious background but instead all students are encouraged to engage with the team. No worry is too small.

Counselling

The Student Counselling and Wellbeing Service is a free and confidential service which is available to all registered UL students. The service is staffed by qualified and experienced Clinical Psychologists, Student Counsellors, Intern/Trainee Psychotherapists, and Assistant Psychologists. Together they provide an extensive array of skill, expertise, and knowledge, equipping them to work with a wide range of personal issues. The counselling service provides a free and confidential service from 9am - 5pm, Monday to Friday. It is the first point of contact for your mental health care needs. Students begin by attending a drop-in service which runs each weekday throughout the semester, after which further supports will be offered depending upon their needs and the resources available. Typical supports include online supports, short-term counselling, or referral to a specialist mental health service.
