PeerScholar (peer review) now openly available




The VLE Management Board made the decision to enable <u>PeerScholar</u>, our tool for peer review, in all module sites by default. PeerScholar works in integration with BrightSpace and facilitates multiple peer assessment workflows including classic peer and self-assessment activities, teamwork and group work activities, team member evaluations, and case study activities.

Students can submit and peer assess multimodal resources: text, videos, audio, computer code, documents, and LaTeX content, annotations and inline comments (including video timeline annotation). It also allows teachers granular control over grading, access to validated rubrics, or creating your own.

Rubrics help to clarify assignment expectations, ensure consistent and transparent grading, provide specific feedback in efficient ways to large classes, and offer data for program improvement. Overall, rubrics support learning and fair evaluation, while it can help you to grade more effectively and efficiently. Reminder: Imported Turnitin Assignments

When you import assignments with Turnitin enabled from another module, you'll need to manually re-enable Turnitin for the assignments. After the content is imported, you'll see a notification in the Assignments tool area prompting you to re-enable Turnitin. If you don't re-enable, Turnitin will not work for submissions, and it cannot be applied retroactively.

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Best practice and FAQS for using the Grades tool

The Grades tool is a powerful, but complex tool requiring some learning curve. When using this tool, we recommend you the following:

- Not to use the Grades tool in BS to enter examination grades
- Make it clear to your students that coursework grades in the VLE are different from module grades, which are provisional in nature
- Keep it simple and consistent: grade everything out of 100 in Assignments, Rubrics, Discussions or Quizzes, then reweight in the Grades tool.
- Use Grade Scheme over Numeric grade item types (not over Letter Grades 'Select box'

item type) to avoid grade distortion. Learn more in this video.

Below, we have curated some FAQs/tips that may come handy:

Why did my students get a grade notification when I published my grades in the Assignments tool?

If you have linked a Brightspace Assignment to the Grades tool and wish to 'Publish' grades in the Assignment tool so that they populate the Grades tool, it's important to make sure the grade item in the Grades tool is hidden first. Otherwise Brightspace will generate a notification to students containing the published grade. I would like to release by assignment feedback and grades separately, how can I do this?

The easiest way to do this is to use the Assignments tool to provide feedback and enter the grades manually in the Grades tool (keep the item hidden until you are ready to release grade). If you are using a Rubric to calculate the grade within Assignments, it can be hidden from students, so they don't see the score.

I have a large class, and I would like to provide feedback using an Excel document, how can I do this?

First, In Manage Grades, set up the grade item. Then, export the gradebook into Excel CVS, add your grades/feedback and save locally. Finally, import into the Grades tool. To learn more, <u>watch this video</u>.
