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MEDICAL COUNCIL



Following the Council's 2019 inspection of HSE Midwest sites under the regional approach to clinical training site inspections, an update was requested in 2023 on the recommendations outlined in the inspection reports. In 2024 61 recomendations were converted to fully compliant and there were also 61 recomendations being advanced across the six hospitals. Documents and guidance have been provided to assist with completing the first returns are being submitted in January 2025, followed by subsequent submissions on 17th July 2025. UHL, UMHL, Croom, Ennis, Nenagh and St John's Hospitals continue to progress in actions converting to full compliance on the recommendations from the Medical Council.

NCHD CONFERENCE

The 2024 NCHD Conference was held on the 16th May 2024 at University Hospital Limerick. Over 150 research abstracts were submitted, with 99 displayed as electronic posters, and 12 Specialty winners presented to a large audience.

POSTGRADUATE MEDICAL TRAINING COMMITTEE

In 2024, the Training Lead Office re-established the Postgraduate Medical Training Committee at HSE Midwest hospital sites, chaired by the NDTP Training Lead. The committee provides governance and strategic direction for NCHD training and education, focusing on funding, high-quality training environments, and compliance with national standards. Key roles include enhancing training quality, monitoring action plans, supporting initiatives, promoting the ULHG NCHD App, and collaborating with Lead NCHDs and stakeholders.

NCHD CAREERS EVENING

The annual NCHD Careers Evening took place in CERC, UHL on 10th October 2024. It was a great success with over 100 NCHDs and medical students in attendance. 32 specialties were represented including BST, HST and GP Schemes. NCHDs had the opportunity for one

on one career discussions and 8 specialties were showcased by Consultants and senior clinicians in more detail in our auditorium.

Enhanced Clinical Skills Workshop For International Medical Graduates

In line with the National NCHD Taskforce Final Recommendations Report, The Training Lead Office with support from the Simulation Technician at University of Limerick, organised the first Enhanced Clinical Skills Training for International Medical Graduates at the CERC Simulation Lab on 9th July 2024. Featuring Urinary Catheterization, IVL, Phlebotomy, Blood Culture, ABG, Haemovigilance & ECG. It was a great success with 92% would like to attend more practical clinical skills training and simulation training in the future. This will be run again in January 2025 with new cohort of NCHDs.





Bleep Policy Review and Restructure

To address NCHD Taskforce recommendations on protected time and work-life balance, a Bleep Policy subgroup was formed, including Training Lead Office, NCHD Leads, and Nursing and Operational Directorate representatives. The group reviews bleep policies, allocations, and lunchtime bleep-free periods. Aiming to reduce personal mobile use for clinical issues, a pilot program is underway in the Medicine Directorate.

SpR Hub & Healthy Eating Options

Specialist Registrars Hub, Ground Floor, Nurses Home, UHL is now operational. Thanks to funding provided by NDTP and coordination by the Operational Directorate and Training Lead Office at HSE Midwest. The purpose of this hub is to provide additional hot desks and meeting room with smart TV screen for SPR's to facilitate work, meetings, online training and research that would also enhance patient care.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT REFURBISHMENT


